
Transects

22 finished, ready for checking


1702 walks carried out

Butterflies recorded by transect week 2021 and 2022




The red dotted lines show when heatwayes occurred in 2022

The next heat wave was 11-14 August - Thurs-



Totals 2021: 4954 2022: 4249


Fontmell Down 2014 and 2022


Transect counts at Fontmell Down 2021 and 2022








Meadow Brown (Blue) and Gatekeeper (Purple)

Website butterflies

- Nearly 70,000 butterflies recorded so far this year – similar to last year's total
- Meadow Brown and Gatekeeper are the top two species
- Small White was 2nd in 2021, 2020 and 2019, but is 4th at the moment, after Marbled White
